

Bob Phillips is an accomplished criminal trial lawyer, who has prosecuted and defended criminal cases for 35 years, the last 30 of which have been in Williamson County, from his historic Georgetown office building, adjacent to the Williamson County courthouse.

Bob has tried more than 250 jury trials, and disposed of more than 10,000 felony and misdemeanor cases in his illustrious career, including prosecution and defense of thousands of DWI, sexual assault, murder, white collar crime, and drug cases. He has been Board Certified in Criminal Law since 1989, and was the first Williamson County defense lawyer to earn that distinction. *Texas Monthly Magazine* has named him a "Super Lawyer" four times (2006, 2008, 2009, 2010), a distinction that less than 10% of Texas lawyers earn even once.

Bob's long-time passion, in addition to trying criminal cases, has been broadcasting. He has found the time, in his busy professional and family life (husband to Jeanne for 36 years, father of five, and grandfather to three) to develop his talent for sports play-by-play, as well as talk radio. He was the co-host of a two and a half year program on KLGQ Radio in Austin, from 2011-2014, called "Speaking of Sports," and now is the host of his own drive-time talk show on The Bridge KTXW 1120 AM, 5-7 p.m. weekdays. The show, "Bob Phillips: Speaking of Everything," has included interviews with local and national politicians, civil rights activists, lawyers, police chiefs, city councilmen, and sports figures.

Bob's show explores everything from national crime stories, to the presidential race, to local politics, culture, moral and spiritual trends, all from a Christian perspective.

"I pride myself on being an objective student of modern Texas and America, and cultivating a lively and provocative discussion of all issues relevant to my listeners, whether they be Christian or not," says Bob. "The shows I like the best are the ones where there are opposing views presented, on live radio from the spokesman representing those views, so that my listeners can decide for themselves what they believe and how to react."
